

Employee Health Reporting Requirements

(Ohio Administrative Code 3717-1-02.1)

Food employees and conditional employees are to report to the person in charge when the employee:

Has any of the following symptoms:

Vomiting	Jaundice (yellowing of skin or whites of eyes)	Exposed lesion with pus that is not properly protected
Diarrhea	Sore throat with fever	

Properly protected exposed lesion or wound on the hands means covered with an impermeable bandage **and** the use of a single-use glove. For exposed lesion on the arms an impermeable cover is required. For all other parts of the body; a dry, tight-fitting bandage is required. The person in charge will exclude or restrict the employee to reduce the risk of foodborne disease transmission. These symptoms all require restriction at minimum, except for sore throat and fever while working with a highly susceptible population, you must exclude.

Exclusion = May not come to work or enter an FSO or RFE as an employee

Restriction = May work but not with exposed food, clean equipment, utensils, linens or unwrapped single-service or single-use articles

Has an illness diagnosed by a health care provider due to:

Campylobacter	Cryptosporidium	Cyclospora	Entamoeba histolytica
Shiga toxin-producing Escherichia coli (STEC)	Giardia	Hepatitis A	Norovirus
Salmonella spp. or Salmonella typhi	Shigella spp.	Vibrio cholerae	Yersinia

Is living in the same household as an individual diagnosed with the following illnesses or Has recently been part of a confirmed disease outbreak for the following illnesses within last exposure time frames:

Norovirus <small>within 48 hours</small>	Shiga toxin-producing Escherichia coli (STEC) <small>within 10 days</small>	
Hepatitis A <small>within 50 days</small>	Salmonella Typhi <small>within 14 days</small>	Shigella spp. <small>within 4 days</small>

The person in charge is required to contact the Erie County Health Department (419) 626-5623 to report health care diagnosed illnesses listed above to the Environmental Health Division or the Office of Epidemiology and Surveillance.

Removal of exclusions or restrictions may be removed from the Person-in-Charge when released by the health care provider or approval from the licensor. Removal of restrictions may be removed by the PIC when the symptoms listed above have ceased and the illness was not from one listed above.
